





Inclusion of Children with Hearing Loss in Early Childhood settings

Deafness and hearing loss are now able to be identified in babies from birth. Increasingly, staff who work in early childhood settings are involved with these very young babies and children and their families/whanau.







Virtually every subject requires some reading and/or writing. Therefore, it is not a surprise that dyslexia can affect learning in all subject areas, including fundamental deficits in:

- accessing written text
- reading fluency
- spelling
- written expression
- organising
- following written directions
- sequencing
- using working memory (needed for problem solving)
- visual processing (especially critical for worksheets, textbooks, and tests)



C-Pen Reader Pen

Hands on - How to use the C-Pen Reader

Rather than just being a tool for reluctant readers the C-Pen Reader Pen is a tool that has applications for almost anyone dealing with printed text.


- **Reading feature** scan single words for clarity or scan whole sentences and use as text to speech in the text reader mode.
- **Dictionary support** powerful way to understand what you are reading, get clarification and pronunciations as you read through the story.
- Scanning text text can be scanned directly to a word processor. Excellent for worksheets. Use Voice typing to answer the questions
- Record Use the C-Pen to scan the text to hear the content and record answers directly on the pen.


Mind maps can provide dyslexic people with a better way to organise and assimilate information.

In addition to robust software like *Dragon Professional Individual* – dictation options can be found on iOS devices, Android devices, Windows and Mac operating systems and in a number of Chrome apps and extensions.

Students who have difficulty spelling can just speak their words and have them transcribed on the screen. It may also help remove some of the difficulties of proofreading by reading back what students have written out loud, allowing for easier editing.
